AT CHRISTMAS, VANCOUVER URBAN MINISTRIES PROVIDED 85 FAMILIES WITH A HAMPER AND GIFTS

We discovered that Jason and his mom had ended up in shelter over Christmas. This gave us the opportunity to provide all the kitchen and household goods they needed to settle into new accommodation.

KINGDOM LIFE COMMUNITY CHURCH

Over Christmas, we partnered with Langley Community Services and gave out over 70 bags of groceries to several families. As a result, we connected with two separate Eritrean families who, we discovered later, knew each other when they arrived as refugees in Manitoba. One family in particular has since become part of our KLCC family. We are so blessed.

Our Pakistani sponsored family is now settled, trained, and employed. Our Congolese family has increased in independence, proficiency in English, and will likely be planning a wedding soon!

In our own church, we have seen a budding romance come full bloom, and two of our Seniors are now officially engaged. Praise God.

Given the diverse makeup of our church, we were profoundly impacted by the racial crisis and outrage in the US. We celebrate the fact that we have wrestled with, prayed into, and boldly spoken out in those spaces the Lord continues to open for us.

Jorge, a member of **Cornerstone**, comes from Colombia. His praise story spans many miles.

It all started last year when his sister,
Teresa, & her husband, Arturo, were
locked down in Colombia. Teresa was
working from home, but Arturo lost his job
and they reached out to Jorge for prayer.
Then came the questions. What does the
Bible say about the pandemic? Is the end
of days near? In time they asked Jorge to
teach them the Bible.

Jorge began a daily devotional time with them over Zoom and, beginning in Acts, explained the birth of the Church & the work of the Holy Spirit through the disciples.

As they worked through the New Testament, soon Teresa & Arturo accepted Jesus as their Lord and Saviour!

They are in contact with Fellowship International missionary, Diego Cardona, and have been linked with a church in their town.

Teresa & Arturo hope to visit Canada soon and, when they do, want to be baptized!

This pandemic has greatly affected the seniors' communities globally, producing a lot of anxiety, isolation, depression, lack of involvement in activities, and social

connections. This has taught us to be innovative in engaging them in other ways. With this in mind, the Golden Roots Seniors' Project, funded by the government's New Horizon for Seniors Program (NHSP), is connecting and engaging seniors with adult volunteers from our congregation and others in the city of Richmond.

In this Golden Roots project, 40 seniors are writing an inspirational story. These stories will be bilingual. We will print each of them in four books (10 stories per book), publish them online on our website, produce audio books, broadcast, and donate these inspirational books to libraries, senior centres, and local community centers. We pray that these inspirational stories of seniors would bring God-honouring impact to our communities and leave a great legacy to their grandchildren and generations to come.

We will also donate a tablet to each senior and our adult volunteers will teach them how to surf the internet and attend zoom meetings so they can become more familiar and more comfortable with our online church services and other



technological challenges in their new virtual environment.
